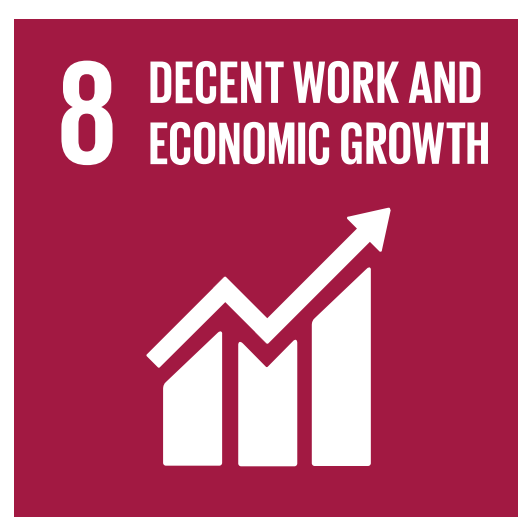
## Work
