### Update from Faculty of Engineering and Science

In February 2025 a group of about 20 University of Greenwich Link Tutors from three of our Faculties, plus the relevant External Examiners, travelled to the October University for Modern Sciences and Arts (MSA), Cairo, Egypt. This is one of two short annual visits made to MSA to carry out the moderation of student work across the large number of programmes that we quality assure.

The visit began with colleagues looking at student projects and listening to many of them present their work. There was also an opportunity to take part in some of the Biotechnology experiments measuring brain function. The standard of work across all disciplines was as exceptional as ever and it was a privilege to be able to meet and interact with the MSA students.

There were many opportunities for discussion with academic and professional service staff and a delightful surprise visit from the founder of the University, Dr Nawal El Degwi. The visit culminated in a series of exam boards for all the different subject areas.

We are hoping to run more programmes with MSA from September 2025, as well as strengthen and develop our research collaborations. [Full article](#)

## PGCert HE Applications 25-26

**Applications are now open for the University of Greenwich Postgraduate Certificate in Higher Education (PGCert HE) starting in October 2025.**

Join our distance learning programme to earn a Postgraduate Certificate in Higher Education and Advance HE Fellowship!

- Application deadline: 14 July 2025
- Programme begins: 13 October 2025

**Applications after the deadline will not be considered.**

The **Postgraduate Certificate in Higher Education (PGCert HE)** is a 13-month distance learning programme (60-credit, Level 7). PGCert HE is ideal for anyone currently teaching at Level 4 or above in higher education. Key areas of focus include higher education pedagogy, curriculum design, inclusive assessment and feedback, and technology-enhanced learning, all underpinned by critical reflection on your teaching.

This is a distance learning programme, but you will have plenty of opportunities to study as part of a learning community. Our curriculum includes a range of learning resources, synchronous and asynchronous learning activities, and ample opportunities for feedback and peer-to-peer connections. You will be

supported by your personal tutor throughout your academic journey. Additionally, we organise programme-level activities and CPD workshops to further support you in your learning.

On successful completion of the programme, you will earn a Postgraduate Certificate in Higher Education and Fellowship of the Higher Education Academy (FHEA). Additionally, you can progress to the University of Greenwich's MA in Education to continue your academic journey.

As an entry requirement, you need to have a guaranteed minimum of 60 hours teaching in higher education (Levels 4-7) during the registration period, with at least 10 hours in the first term of the programme. This may include lecturing, tutoring, leading seminars, and similar.

## Improving how students access selected processes

As part of the University of Greenwich's plan to improve student experience and modernise the way that students interact with the University's support services, we will be introducing some changes to the Extenuating Circumstances, Academic Appeals, and Withdrawal and Interruption forms.

From September 2025, partner college students will have access to the Digital Student Centre (DSC) platform, which will allow them to submit the abovementioned forms digitally and ensure that they are received by the relevant processing teams. This will create an improved experience for our students and provide them greater clarity on the processes, navigating them

every step of the way.

Further demonstrations to partners and distribution of supporting materials for both students and staff will be done in the following months.

my time here.

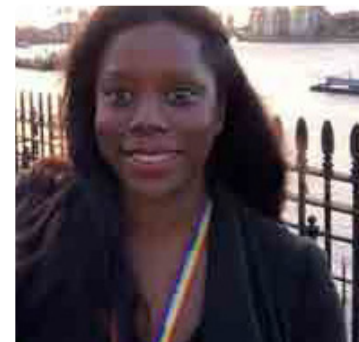

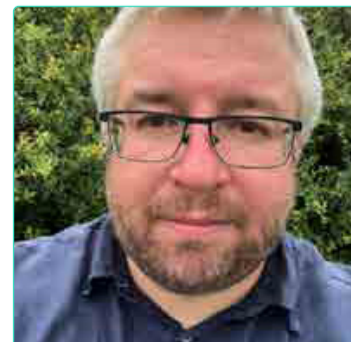
